
The coming-of-age novel of two young Moroccan women: Kenza is born into wealth and Fatiha is the daughter of Kenza's maid. We follow them and their friendship from childhood through adolescence to adulthood, in good times and bad.

Soufiane had promised Fatiha that he would introduce her to his parents and she believed him. They had made love, she became pregnant, but now he was backing out. Desperate, in a country where abortion is against the law, Fatiha seeks out an underground abortionist. Meanwhile, her childhood friend, Kenza, has finished her studies in France and is returning to Morocco. France would not renew her visa. Upon her arrival she looks up Fatiha but her phone doesn't answer.

How did these two women, who were so close in childhood, become so estranged from one another? Fatiha, the Arab-speaking daughter of a maid, and Kenza, daughter of the upper-class, well versed in French culture but so out of touch with normal life in Morocco.

Zineb Mekouar zigzags through the lives of these two women and, through them, tells the story of contemporary Morocco, with its political and social divisions, its elites and its lower classes.

Hamet, a young boy from Bamako, is sent for a few months back to his family village where his two grandmothers live.

Because he skips school to read, eat donuts and play marbles, because he is insolent, because he speaks better French than the French to the detriment of his maternal tongue that he is beginning to forget and because he gets into fights with children who mock his father who emigrated to France... For all these reasons, Hamet's parents decide to punish him by sending him back to his family's native village. They hope the trip will teach him obedience, respect for tradition and humility and they hope he will no longer be a stranger to his people, a lost boy.

Hamet meets his grandmothers, drinks the salty village well-water, works in the fields, becomes friends with the village boys, and learns much more than obedience. He learns his family history, the reason why his parents left their village and he discovers the man who is his father and where he really wants to live. It is a return to roots, a "huis clos" that opens up the world to him and helps him grow up.


JEAN-LUC GAGET THE BROTHERHOOD OF THE SLAPPED

THE BACKPACKER'S GUIDE TO SEXUALITY


Tell me how you make love and I'll tell you what country you're from...

Antonio Fischetti is a seasoned traveller and backpacker who travels with a specific goal in mind: to explore the sexual practices of every country he visits.

And sexual practices can say a lot about a population. The fact that Thailand is perfectly tolerant of transexuals, called ladyboys, reveals the predominance of Buddhist teaching that recognises not just two sexes, but four: male, female, homosexual and hermaphrodite. Religion is not always the enemy of carnal pleasure. Nor is age: in the Himalayas, yarsagumba, a natural viagra, has been used for centuries. This mix of mushrooms and caterpillars sells for 100 000 euros per kilo.

Since pleasure is the common goal of every population, Fischetti imagines geography as a vast boudoir. He investigates with the rigor and discipline of the trained scientist that he is. However, beyond the folklore, some practices raise real questions. Does living completely naked like in some Amazonian tribes, encourage an untamed sexuality?

These are the hidden sides of countries and peoples that tourist guidebooks never mention. Instructive and stimulating.



The sheep adopted by Marc Dugain speak of the human race, and in particular their owner.

Marc Dugain has lived in Brittany in a house near the edge of a cliff for three years. He acquired a piece of land next to his to allow his prized sheep to graze peacefully. People from the village regularly stop by to ask if the land is for sale since they would like to build a house there. To which Dugain invariably responds: "Why shouldn't my sheep enjoy an ocean view?"

Writer, animal lover, particularly sheep lover, Marc Dugain has imagined himself as one of them, to see humans through their eyes, and to see himself. Sheep watch us live, slowly destroying the planet, baffled by a society that has forgotten the link between man and animal, one that privileges its own comforts over the detriment, even the pain and death, of the other.

The ovine also observe the writer. Their frank impressions give free rein to Dugain for self-criticism and irony with no holds barred.

Portraits of twenty sinister, historical figures dating from the third century to the twenty-first.

Hitler, Stalin and Mussolini are the infamous Evil trio but hidden behind them lurks a great number of cruel and despicable characters that posterity has tried hard to erase.

Some have surfaced, such as General Bugeaud, famous for his appalling torture methods during the French-Algerian War, or the child murderer Gilles de Rais, executed in 1440. Other names are familiar because of the influence they had, such as Torquemada, the 16th century Castellan Inquisitor who inspired the play of the same name by Victor Hugo.

But the majority of them would prefer History forget their names. Unfortunately for them, "Bad Guys" has resurrected these unknown loathsome individuals.




